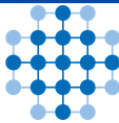

CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES

The goal of this conference is to update participants on current advances in psychiatry and mental healthcare through the theme of *Connected Care: Community and Family Systems of Psychiatry*.
